- Black shorts/leggins/Skorts







Maths

- Counters, cubes, objects










Writing

Reading

The single most important thing you can do for your child's education is to read with your child.

- 3x per week
- Learning Objectives in reading records
- Focus on the challenge in the reading record
- Comment in the book adults only
- Teacher lead whole class reading sessions
- Teacher lead small group guided reading



KS1 Curriculum in a mixed-age classroom

- The National Curriculum is framed as 'by the end of KS1'
- It is down to schools to set out each year groups curriculum to meet this expectation.
- We will be operating a 2 year, rolling programme to cover the curriculum
- In class, teachers will be differentiating the expectations to ensure children are accessing the curriculum at an appropriate level


