


## Our History

Harleston Sancroft Academy opened in September 2022 as an All Through School serving the community of an incredibly vibrant market town on the Norfolk/Suffolk border.

The school currently operates on two sites that are less than a mile from each other in the town of Harleston.

In 2018, Harleston Primary School and ASHS (Archbishop Sancroft High School) joined St Benet's Multi Academy Trust and in 2019 the two schools Federated, with one Governing Body working across both phases. In 2021, Mr Rob Connelly was appointed as Executive Headteacher of The Harleston Federation and is now the Headteacher of The Harleston Sancroft Academy.

The opening of the All Through School was carefully planned, with significant involvement from St Benet's MAT, The Diocese of Norwich and the local community. We are more than just a school and through enabling and encouraging all staff, children and their families to explore, witness and experience the Christian values that are the cornerstone of all that we do, we are proud to be the Heartbeat of Harleston.

# Our Community

#### **Christian Ethos**

Collective worship is an important part of our life as a Church school and our programme provides an excellent opportunity for our whole community to take time out of the normal hectic day to focus on issues beyond the taught curriculum. Local church groups are weekly visitors to our school providing mentoring opportunities, lunchtime activities and external collective worship.

Every member of the school community shares in a daily act of worship. This meets the requirements of the 1988 Education Act, which states that every child must attend an act of worship every day and that these acts of worship should be "predominantly Christian". This may be in one of: Year group or House Assemblies; in class or through Form Time with class teachers or form tutors, or in our dedicated Prayer Space in smaller groups.

Relationships are at the heart of all we do in our school. They are the cornerstone of our values, our teaching, our learning, and our future. Emotional wellbeing contributes greatly to academic and professional success – all of our staff members support our children to ensure that potential is recognised and barriers to children achieving their potential are identified and addressed.

#### **Mental Health and Pastoral Support**

We take a whole-school approach to mental health and encourage children and staff to think about both their mental and physical wellbeing and make sure relevant information is always available. Our trained Wellbeing Council in the Primary Phase and Mental Health Leaders in the Secondary Phase play a vital role in this. Furthermore, our full-time pastoral teams across the school provide trained, specialist staff to help children and adults with their concerns or worries as well as providing advice on where to seek further support.

#### **The Student Voice**

Our children are the essence of our school and therefore the 'voice of the children' is of paramount importance to us. Our School Council provides children with further opportunities to develop a voice. Children are represented across all year groups and are encouraged to take an active part in whole school improvements. Our children's voice is evident in new appointments made at Harleston Sancroft Academy. Child-led panels are used and the child's voice is heard and represented. We appoint Head students and a Student leadership team. These come from elections held and child votes. This helps provide opportunities to further promote democratic values.

There is also an open door policy that ensures concerns, ideas and feedback from the children is always welcomed and sought.

## **Curriculum Overview**

#### **Curriculum Intent**

All children are unique and the curriculum intent at Harleston Sancroft Academy is to provide our pupils with a knowledge-rich, vocabulary-driven, skills-based curriculum which will enable all pupils to 'Live life in all its fullness' (John 10:10).

By embedding knowledge-rich learning we create and build opportunities for children to look within and outside of their own context. We enrich their experiences through high quality vocabulary acquisition, leading children to develop a greater understanding of the world around them.

A skills-based approach to contextualising learning, through thought-provoking questions and meaningful opportunities, enables children to apply what they have been taught. Through the implementation of our curriculum, a distinct body of knowledge relevant to our community creates an ambitious curriculum which builds piece by piece through a carefully considered sequence from the Early Years through to the end of Key Stage 4.

#### **Curriculum Implementation**

The implementation of the curriculum is underpinned by our core values - Hope, Perseverance, Wisdom, Love, Respect and Faith; as well as the broader British Values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect.

The curriculum has been built upon a clear understanding of what makes great teaching and effective learning with a recognition that everyone in our school community is a learner, who can enhance and extend their understanding. We focus on building students' knowledge beyond the test, by teaching a broad and balanced curriculum.



#### **Curriculum Impact**

We believe that the curriculum is the progression model. Students have made progress if they have learnt a subject's programme of study. We place more emphasis on teaching to the curriculum and not to the test. As a result of responsive teaching, regularly reviewing learning and revisiting knowledge, students develop mastery in their subjects. The impact of our knowledgerich, vocabulary-driven, skills-based curriculum can be measured through

academic success in national assessments and through our clearly-structured assessment framework.

The impact of our curriculum can be seen through the readiness of children to engage in their next steps. Children are equipped with the knowledge, vocabulary and skills necessary to continue on their learning journey, to be successful citizens in the world around them and to 'Live life in all its Fullness', from *Sancroft and Beyond*.
