In form time over the coming days, students will be marking 'Holocaust Memorial Day' (HMD).

Each year, people across the UK take part in a national moment for HMD. They light a candle in their window to remember those murdered and to stand against hatred today.

This year's particular focus is the 'Fragility of Freedom': "Today many people in western democracies take freedoms for granted – this HMD, we can reflect on how these freedoms need to be valued, and on how many people around the world face restrictions to their freedoms to live, worship, work and love freely [...] On HMD 2024, we can all reflect on how freedom is fragile and vulnerable to abuse. As we come together in communities around the UK, let's pledge not to

take our freedoms for granted, and consider what we can do to strengthen freedoms around the world."

This very short poem, by Moshe Szulsztein, calls to mind the victims' shoes, that speak volumes to us across the decades:

We Are The Shoes

We are the shoes, we are the last witnesses.

We are shoes from grandchildren and grandfathers

From Prague, Paris and Amsterdam,

And because we are only made of fabric and leather

And not of blood and flesh,

Each one of us avoided the hellfire.
